

Easy Tube Pillow Case Tutorial

Fabric Requirements:

- Main Pillowcase Fabric – 27 inches (3/4 of a yard)
- The Cuff Fabric – 9 inches
- Piping Material – 2 - 2 inches



Directions:

1. Start by cutting your fabrics at the appropriate lengths
2. Main Pillowcase Fabric – 27 inches (3/4 of a yard) b
3. The Cuff Fabric – 9 inches
4. Piping Material – 2 – 3 inches
5. Optional - cut off your selvages (you can do this later)
6. Press Piping fabric in half wrong sides together
7. Take your Cuff fabric and lay it down on your table FACE UP.



8. Then you will take your Piping Fabric and line that up with the other 2 fabrics. Lining up all the raw edges at the top.



9. Once this is all lined up you are going to take your Main Pillowcase Fabric and start to roll it up into a tube.



10. Stop once your roll looks like the picture to right



11. Then you are going to fold you Cuff Fabric up and over the tube and line all of the raw edges of your Main Pillowcase Fabric, Cuff Fabric, and Piping Fabric together and pin them.



12. Once you line all of the edges up and have them pinned together you can take the tube to your sewing machine and sew a ¼ inch seem down the pinned edge

13. Reach inside and pull the tube out.

14. Once you have removed the tube, and have it laying out flat it should look like this:



15. Now you will need to fold your Pillowcase right side together and take it back to your sewing machine. Start by sewing the side of your pillowcase with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam (you can use a French seam if desired). Then a zig zag stitch or serge.

16. Then you will sew the top of the pillowcase with the same $\frac{1}{4}$ seam followed by zig zag or serge seam.

17. You will need to fold the piping up and toward the cuff and iron it down
