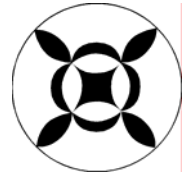

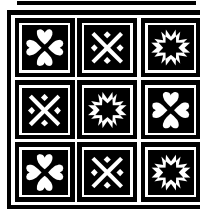

Tip of the Month

Quick Layouts--Spread a sheet on the floor and lay out your blocks. Pin each block in place to the underlying sheet. You can now unroll the sheet, unpin and assemble a row or two, pin that row back into position, roll the sheet back up and keep everything in place until your next sewing opportunity.

Store your glue sticks used for appliqué in the refrigerator. This keeps them firmer, making them easier to use and longer lasting.
