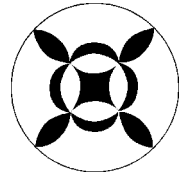

President's Pieces

Dear Quilters,

Whoever joined the words "spring" and "cleaning" in the same sentence had to be nuts. Somehow, though, when spring trickles in I get that urge to do my "spring cleaning". This year I've taken on a new system called the "twofer plan". For each two hour block of time I spend in my sewing room, I spend one hour on my spring cleaning. It sure sounds fair to me. We'll see what the end result is. Of course I MUST start with the two hours in the sewing room!

On to a more serious note, we have no new President or Vice President to serve for the 2009-2010 year. I'd hopes that my ardent plea at the last meeting would have inspired some brave souls to step out of their comfort zone and volunteer. I know in my heart there are many capable women who would do an excellent job leading our Club forward. Where are you?? We need you. Please be assured that if you volunteer there are Past Presidents who would mentor you along the way. (I've used my mentors when I've had doubts during my terms in office. How reassuring it was to know they were there to listen and advise.) You also have the advantage of having an experienced Secretary and Treasurer to assist you. Both Secretary Melissa Manney and Treasurer Kathy Russell are great to work with. At our Annual Meeting on April 27th the only item on the agenda will be to fill the offices of Vice President and President for next year. I've come to a roadblock and don't know how to proceed without your help. I will say that in the future it will be imperative that we have a "nominating committee"

to secure new officers, not the outgoing President. A "nominating committee" would have had more ideas and possibilities that I alone could muster. Perhaps, they also could have encouraged different volunteers than I considered. How can YOU help? How do YOU see us solving this dilemma?

We have many opportunities for you to share your quilting skills. First, Kathy Russell has "six packs" of casserole carriers for Meals on Wheels that you could stitch up. They're really quite simple: you zigzag each end and then sew up the side seams. Voila, you're done! Be sure to use a heavy duty "jeans needle" in your sewing machine for best results. They're easy and you can sew up six (hence the "six pack") in about a half hour. Our other project for Meals on Wheels is our annual placemat project. We sew and quilt up placemats in patterns and colors of your choice (Linda Kananna has pattern ideas if you need them.) The recipients of Meals on Wheels throughout Monroe County will receive one of your masterpieces to enjoy in their home. Kim Stubbe of the Meals on Wheels office has told me how much the clients really appreciate your work. Bring the placemats in by the May meeting and we'll deliver them at the end of May. Of course Mary Lou Fitch still has bags to sew for the Cancer Society and Elaine Kent always has charity quilt kits ready for you to take home. Michelle Garvey has kits to sew caps for chemo patients, too. See any one of these ladies at the April meeting and they'll set you up with whatever you need.

Our next Sew Day is Saturday, April 25 from 10:00-4:00 at the Church Hall for the cost of \$3. The Stitchers will have breakfast snacks

and you'll need to bring your own lunch. There's lots of table space to spread out and baste that quilt you've been working on all winter. It sure beats basting on the floor at home!! We also have a Sew Night on Friday, May 1 where we're offering a FREE class (as long as you sign up first) to learn how to make the "funky chicken" pin cushion using two log cabin blocks. This might be a great fundraiser as part of our next Quilt Show in 2010. Come and learn how to make one from 7:00-9:00.

Bus Trip

Ladies I know you are getting as excited as I am about our bus trip. Our bus is full and I know we are all ready to shop. We will be visiting Material Rewards, (Dansville, NY) at 8 AM. Material rewards provides quilting fabrics, quilting supplies, quilt kits, fat quarters, handmade quilts for sale, books, notions, etc. (www.materialrewards.com), Village Sampler (Big Flats, NY) at about 10:30 AM. Village

Sampler carries over 4200 bolts of the finest 100% cotton fabric, patterns, notions, cross stitch charts, fibers, etc. (www.villagesampler.com). Then we go to the Churn Dash (Owego, NY) at about 1 PM. Churn Dash is a full service fabric shop. They carry over 2500 bolts of quality 100% cotton fabric for quilting and clothing sewing. There are over 200 book titles available as well as patterns, kits, and notions. (www.churndashfabrics.com) Then we will head for Pucky Huddle Delight (Candor, NY) at about 3:00 PM. Pucky Huddle delight has quilting fabrics and supplies which includes patterns, books, notions, and classes. (www.puckyhuddledelight.com)

If you joined us last year we parked at the **Rush-Henrietta Transportation & Operations Center** at 1133 Lehigh Station Road. (From 390 South, take the Lehigh Station exit and turn towards 15A. The Operations Center is located at the corner of Lehigh Station Road and Middle Roads with the driveway on Lehigh Station Road). The bus will leave the parking lot at 7 AM sharp in order to keep us on schedule. All participants should plan on bringing a bag lunch which will be eaten on the bus. Bottled water will be provided. Please bring a snack to share with the others on the bus if you can. Also, we will be stopping on the way home to pick up dinner to be eaten on the bus unless we decide to eat when we get home. Show and Tell

Jean Cody displayed a two tone green and pink quilt using 9 patch squares and stars she made as a wedding gift. Karen Stanley from Ontario quilted it.

Patty Pellegrino's daughter is getting married. For her first shower, Patti made a lovely table runner with gerbera daisies (the bride-to-be's favorite flower) accented with purple (the groom-to-be's favorite color) and green.

Bev Schwartz made a tool fabric themed quilt for her husband. She also hand quilted a "Venetian Windows" pattern quilt with a variety of fabrics in brown, beige, black and yellow.

Gretchen Rehberg designed two quilts herself. The first was a forest green, gold and peach/rust combination in an Italian tile looking pattern and the second was done in a brown and gold oriental floral with a brown swirl accent fabric with large oriental fish fused and appliquéd in the center of the quilt.

Debbie Butler made the professional tote in turquoise and navy batiks. She also complete a darling primary color wide striped buttoned bunting w/ some dinosaur fabric and lined in yellow minky – unbuttoned it becomes a blanket.

Freida DeCaire made a Scrap Therapy “Charming Buds” quilt – a windowpane pattern with a floral border as well as a Scrap Therapy “Scrap Sack” with a variety of batiks with purple batik sides, lining and handles. Her third item was a lovely burgundy, green, gold and floral fabric quilt she made at Jackie Lynn’s Boot Camp earlier this month. She quilted it on the HQ16 long arm as part of the camp.

Rene Flogarty and Marcia Morano also attended Jackie Lynn’s Boot Camp. Rene’s quilt which she will give to her daughter was made with green, brown and beige fabrics. Marcia will send her tropical floral fabric in turquoise, orange and pink accented with light and dark turquoise to her daughter in Hawaii.

Helen Kohut made two gorgeous 30’s fabric quilts with large Dresden plate designs – one with a 30’s green border and the other with a pieced tumbler border of the 30’s fabrics. Each was intricately machine quilted and the backs were as lovely as the fronts!! She also made a charm squares tote in fall colors.

Mary Jane Kosel made a “Take 5 pattern” quilt for her husband in US Marine Corps. themed fabric with blue and red accents. The back was a large USMC panel with the emblem, planes and a young marine (her husband a few years ago!).

Chris Clark made an adorable “I Spy” quilt for her grandson Owen. It featured “bone animals” (dinosaurs) on the front and back. She also completed a “Reflecting Star” pattern quilt in peach and cream featuring

diagonal mirror star images in the two fabrics.

Lin Mocejunas finished a charm square tote as a gift for a non-quilting friend in pink, green and white fabrics. The pattern is from the 2009 Better Homes and Garden’s Creative Collection magazine titled “Bags, Pillows and Pincushions”.

Elaine Kent found time to make an adorable Fons & Porter pattern “Little Peepers” from their 2008 issue “Baby Quilts”. She used yellow, green and light blue fabric for the “peepers” accented with Winnie the Pooh and a striped fabric.

Elaine reports that 26 comfort quilts were completed in February and 16 so far for March for a total so far of 143 for the 2008-09 year. She encouraged members to pick up the kits or make their own using 6 ½” squares to make a 42” x 54” quilt (7 squares by 9 squares).

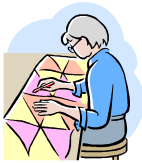
