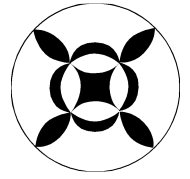

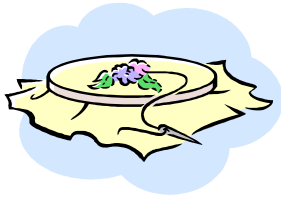

### **Shhhhhh!**

Quiet please!

Ladies, imagine this scenario. You are one of many people in the audience sitting in a large, multi-purpose room. There is a

head table of people who are informing you of important matters pertinent to the group. A microphone is being used so everyone in the room can hear the important information. However, some people in the large room have difficulty hearing the information being disseminated because some in the audience are having their own meeting at the same time the person at the microphone is speaking.

Webster's New World College Dictionary definition of microphone is: "an instrument containing a transducer that converts the mechanical energy of sound waves into an electric signal, used in telephony, radio, sound amplification, etc." The words in the definition that need to be emphasized are **sound amplification**. ### **AQSG Quilt Block Challenge**

The American Quilt Study Group (AQSG), a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving the history of quilts and quilting, is turning 30! We invite you to join the celebration by participating in a nationwide block challenge called "**30s for 30**" (see details below). For every 30 blocks received, one person's name will be drawn to win those blocks. To learn more about AQSG and our annual Seminar, please visit our website at

### **30s for 30 Quilt Block Challenge**

- Blocks must be 12-1/2" square (to finish to a 12-inch block)

and made of either 1930s reproduction fabrics or vintage 1930s fabrics. Fabrics must be 100% cotton. *Please prewash/preshrink all fabrics.*

- Blocks may be any design and any color combination, in keeping with the 1930s fabrics.
- Send your blocks to the address below, along with a donation of \$3 for the first block, and \$1 for each block thereafter sent at the same time. Block donations from groups are welcome. Any funds collected in excess of those needed to complete the project will be donated to the AQSG Endowment fund.
- The blocks will be photographed and the photos will be posted on the AQSG website, along with the maker's name and state (or country).
- Blocks will be compiled into sets of thirty. At Seminar 2010 in Minneapolis (Oct. 14-17), we will have a drawing for the various sets. For each block that you send, your name will be entered once into the drawing. You do not need to be present to win.
- Deadline for submitting blocks is Oct. 1, 2010.

We've received a call for help from Cheryl Dudinetz. From her email, a request is being made for quilt donations which will benefit Camp Erin.

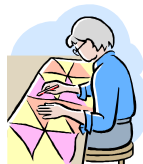
"Camp Erin is sponsored by the Moyer Foundation to honor Erin
