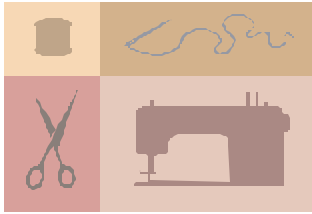

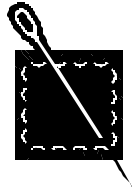

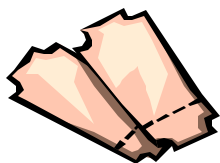

### May Meeting Minutes

Carol Samboro spoke at the May meeting on creating texture (and excitement) on garments and quilts. She used an article from the March 2001 Threads Magazine for the beginning ideas for her texturing "career". Carol brought in various articles of clothing that she has designed using this method. She layers two fabrics (the top fabric should be washed, the underneath fabric is unwashed and a type of fabric that you know will shrink, such as gauze, cheesecloth, muslin, or quilting cotton). She suggested creating samples first. If using gauze, she suggested using 3 layers as the underneath fabric. Stitch across your sandwich in a pattern or freeform, then wash in hot water and dry on high. You want to shrink the underneath fabric. You will have a puckered, textured material, which you can then use to cut out a pattern for clothing or use in a patchwork quilt. Carol also modeled a vest, which was made with snippets, sandwiched between two layers of dissolving stabilizer. She used a 40 weight variegated cotton thread to sew

over and over the stabilizer, anchoring the stabilizer, anchoring the snippets, so that when the stabilizer sheets are dissolved, the snippets will be held together as one fabric. It was a fun lecture.

Laurie Fromm spoke about the Greater Rochester Quilt Coalition and the display planned at Greece Ridge Mall on Make a Difference weekend in October. Barnes and Noble will print signs for us free of charge and will help with promotions. They are looking for 15-20 quilts, in traditional patterns for the quilt turning. See Laurie if you have any quilts for the bed turning. They will of course be returned to you!
