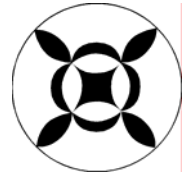

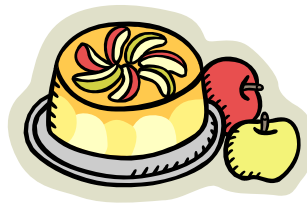

Show and Tell Review

At our Final meeting of the year in May, we had many members who shared their quilts. **Ava Conchelos** showed a quilt from **Joan Sadler** that she finished and donated to "Women Helping Girls". **Penny Schumacher** presented her rag quilt with a diagonal pattern that she

finished in April. It'll be perfect for the chilly fall and winter nights. She also had a purple and green top that needed the appliqué in each corner. **Mary Randall** was looking for something new for her living room so she made "French Country Stars" using fabric from her stash. The pattern came from "Better Homes and Gardens Quilts and More." **Jeanne Muhl** and **Jackie Root** appliquéd a floral vase wall hanging for Sunset House. (That's the house you see on your left as you leave the Church parking lot. It's open for comfort care for terminally ill patients.) **Ruth Tetlow** brought in her birthday present: a "quilt cake" made of fat quarters and decorated with all sorts of quilting notions. (There's a pattern for it available at Jackie Lynn's and other quilt shops.) **Brenda McHale** brought in projects for classes she's teaching. The first one used a large print fabric with 3 other complimentary fabrics. The second quilt was made from fabric Brenda fell in love with--red, black and white. **Celeste Babcock** had some blue work blocks from **Mary Jane Kosel** and tried out new stitches on her sewing machine to appliqué the blocks. She also used LOTS of blue fabric from her stash. **Ruth Fell** went to a Kaye Wood retreat in April and showed us her pink paisley tote bag. Her fabric (very cool) came from Joann's. **Jean Cody** took a class called "Stash Busters" at Patricia's in January and shared the end result: a stunning quilt for her nephew who's getting married. It was blue, purple and butterflies, with over 100 fussy cut butterflies in the center. WOW! **Liz Brown** completed a Virginia Avery "bog coat" that she started over 10 years ago and showed it. (See it's NEVER too late to finish

something you started!!) Liz also had a bag she made at a quilt retreat in Batavia. **Lin Mocejunas** shared a "string quilt" she made from scraps in her stash! What a great way to use scraps!! **Frieda DeCaire** brought in a jacket she began at Pam's in Webster 8 years ago. The black oriental fabric was stunning and the Seminole borders really looked perfect. **Elaine Kent** wrapped up our Show and Tell with an update on charity quilts. 14 quilts were sent to Daystar a facility that cares for critical care babies. Elaine received 32 quilts in April, 31 quilts tonight and a total of 175 quilts between June of 2006 and April of 2007. Very impressive work for all who've helped!!

From a fat Quarter you can cut:

- 99 2" squares
- 50 2½ " squares
- 42 3" squares
- 30 3½" squares
- 20 4" squares
- 16 4½ " squares
- 12 5" squares
- 12 5 ½" squares
- 9 6" squares
- 6 6½" squares
