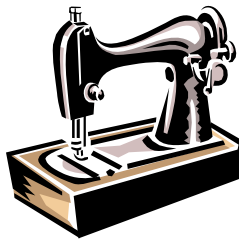

### Show and Tell Review

Our November Show and Tell was loaded with "eye candy" for everyone watching. We began with **Donna German** who showed a pine tree draft dodger filled with kitty litter rather than sand. She also had an exquisite quilt she's planning to hang over the sofa in their "cabin" near Wayland. She broke one of her rules by showing us a quilt that wasn't finished-- it had been quilted but the binding was not done. We didn't mind one bit, **Donna!** **Penny Schumacher** brought in her Challenge winner, "Now the Day is Over and Night is Nigh" This was her first experience with hand turned applique. It was quite a challenge!! She also had her

stunning blue and yellow mariner's compass bed quilt with applique border. WOW! The back is lovely too, so she can flip it over on the bed and make it "dog proof"! **Mary Jane Kosel** showed an excellent quilt called "Bubbles and Beads" done in shades of green for her nephew's very Irish wife! **Zylpha Siudara** charmed us all with her "Big Bird" based on a post card from Switzerland. She even had the original post card scanned and put on the back. The border was based on the oriental rug that sat under the quilt when she was working on it and the pattern in the rug seemed perfect for the border! The other quilt was a magnificent pansy quilt that was hand quilted. In order to show the quilting better Zylpha quilted it from the back so the back is equally lovely! Very impressive! **Ava Conchelos** shared her 2 winning miniatures from the Quilt Show. We can all see why they were winners! **Elaine Nevada** ( I think it was you Elaine. My notes were kind of sketchy and my memory isn't what it used to be so I hope I've given credit to the right person.) brought a stunning yellow and purple applique pansy quilt that reminded her of her mother. There was also the wonderful sampler quilt that was a "Block of the Month" deal that seemed to go on forever (actually 36 blocks!!) though you can see the results were well worth it!! **Lorraine Enge** wowed us with that award winning applique bed quilt from the Quilt Show. Mary Randall was asked by several members to share her apple cake recipe that she brought for treats

### Apple Cake

4 cups peeled apples, cut into small pieces  
 2 cups flour  
 2 cups sugar  
 2 tsp baking soda  
 ½ cup vegetable oil  
 2 tsp cinnamon  
 1 cup chopped walnuts  
 1tsp salt  
 2 eggs, well beaten  
 2 tsp vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Grease and flour a bundt cake pan

In a large bowl, add chopped apples and sugar, mix well. Stir in oil, walnuts, eggs and vanilla.

In a separate bowl, mix flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Add dry ingredients to apple mixture and mix well.

Pour batter into bundt pan. Bake @ 350 degrees for 1 hour. When cool, may sprinkle with confectioners sugar or make a glaze. Enjoy!!

### Tip of the Month

When you cut the triangle of fabric off each corner before washing, cut it with your pinking shears. You get even less fraying than with the straight cut.

When you have left over batting on a finished quilt, rather than throw the extra out, cut them to size and use on a Clorox or Swiffer type floor mop. Cotton works best. Even smaller pieces may be used to clean your machine.

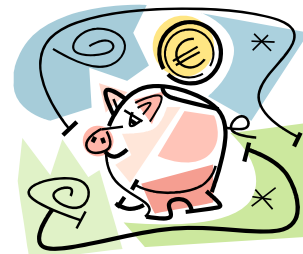
To store templates, use a zippered CD case and place them in the individual compartments. This keeps them in one place and ready for use.
