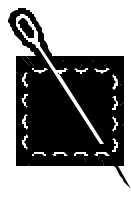

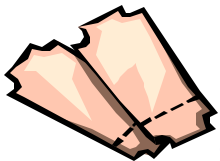

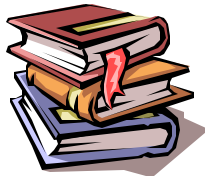

April Meeting Minutes

We began our business meeting with reports from our treasurer and secretary. Following these we had committee reports from:

Sunshine – Please let Donna know of any members that we should send a card to.

Brenda’s Caps – Jane reported that the caps are in prepared kits and ready to be sewn. It is a new style beret and directions are available. Jane is asking for fleece material donations. If you can help, please take one to finish.

Comfort Quilts – Sue and Sue reported that many quilts have been completed. A drawing was held for those that turned in quilts at the meeting. The two winners of this month’s drawing were Pat Ientilucci and Laura Wagner. They both won a scrap bag made by Georgia Sadler. Vivien Terry was also given a scrap bag for her behind the scenes assistance in many areas.

Next month 2 more names will be drawn, so be sure to turn in your quilts!

Lenore from Hope Lodge which is run by the Cancer Society gave us a summary of how our Comfort Quilts are distributed. She thanked the group for their efforts and wanted everyone to

know how much they are appreciated. She assured everyone that the quilts are distributed to all local cancer centers. She explained that Hope Lodge is a place where people come from surrounding county areas to receive their chemotherapy treatments. She wanted us to know that we are doing great work and that the care put into quilt making has a great impact on these individuals.

She stressed that our quilt donations are a symbol of friendship and support and represent the Face of Hope for newly diagnosed cancer patients.

We asked where the needs are the greatest. She says that they are in need of masculine quilts. Sports, western, and wildlife themes are especially appreciated.

There is a fundraiser planned for June and they would appreciate any quilt donations for their auction.

Lenore educated us on the importance of early detection and brought handouts on cancer prevention to be handed out.

“Shop Notes” – Where have you been? One member mentioned quilt shops in the Tampa area. A shop designed and printed fabric featuring the Tampa area.

A few members attended the Lancaster Quilt Show held the first weekend in April. Those attending enjoyed the vendors from all over the country.

2004 “Quilts for All Seasons” Quilt Show Update – The next chairperson committee meeting will be at Donna German’s home

on Wednesday May 19th at 7pm. Anyone is welcome to attend.

Donna reports that things are shaping up in all areas except for someone to chair the Set-up Committee. Donna explained what the responsibilities would involve beginning Friday morning of the show weekend. Pat Bethke has volunteered for the position. Thanks Pat!!

Silent Auction – Chris Clark reported that she is collecting items for the silent auction. She had some examples displayed at the meeting.

Anniversary Quilt - Michele Gailey has put in 50-60 hours on the quilt. Jeanne Muhl will take it for completion. Anyone who can spare some time to help would be appreciated. The goal is to have the quilt completed by the May meeting.

Raffle Tickets - Ruth Tetlow has the raffle tickets the raffle quilt. Sales are coming in. Ruth has more tickets available and indicated that a prize will be given to the member who sells the most tickets! Ruth also has pictures of the quilt available if anyone needs one.

Challenge Quilt – Theme will be “Silver Challenge” for our 25th anniversary. Jane Bodnar has the fabric and instructions for the Challenge Quilt. She asks that a \$5 deposit be placed, which will be returned upon completion of your quilt. All quilts must be returned (completed) by October 1, 2004. Judging- there will be graded sheets with specifics for this category. Our last quilt show had 16 entries.

Quilts to be displayed - There is no need to have sleeves on quilts being displayed in the show. All quilts being displayed must be finished, including a label! Remember that any quilt you want to display must not have been in one of our prior shows. This year we are considering having a section labeled “Rookies Row” for those “first-time” participants. Quilt show quilt entry forms will be available at the May meeting.

Other – Georgia has been researching the possibility of having a Quilt Escape Weekend in the Webster, Henrietta, Greece area for the guild. She is searching for hotels with pools and large conference rooms at an affordable price. More information will be given when available.

A question as to whether to continue the Sew Nights during the summer was raised. Last summer attendance was very poor, so it was decided to discontinue them, however if a good response is made to continue them, then it will be taken into consideration.

Linda Michael suggested that the club should be more actively involved in looking into new community projects.

Consideration for this suggestion will be taken into account as we begin planning for next year.

Gift from Brenda’s Family – discussion on how to use the money donated brought two proposals to vote. 1) Chris Clark put forward an idea that we should use it to purchase masculine fabric for comfort

quilts. 2) Borrowing Cupboard – a member suggested that quilting tools be purchased and loaned out to members (e.g. rulers, templates, suppliers). This would be especially beneficial to new quilters. Someone to manage the cupboard would be needed.

A vote was cast: 32 Purchase Fabric, 21 Borrowing Cupboard.

A committee to purchase the fabric was established. The members are Pat Ientilucci, Sue Reed, and Liz Brown.

Cook Book -

A cook book to commemorate the Guild's 25th Anniversary is being formulated.

We are asking that recipes for the cookbook be submitted on the form available and returned to Georgia by June 1st.

A cost savings of \$0.35 per book could be realized by using the software from the company and Jennifer Steward has volunteered to type them in.

We would like to receive 200-300 recipes for the book. It would be available for purchase for \$5-\$7 to members and then made available for sale at the quilt show.

The cover for the cookbook would be a Mary Engelbrecht style. Profits could be used for funding future club projects.

Election of Officers – The current slate of officers has agreed to return for a 2nd term. Mary Randall set a motion to accept the slate as proposed. Vote was unanimous. Remember that we will be seeking new officers for 2006. Anyone interested should make themselves known to the committee in the coming year.

Dues – A motion was made and seconded to continue \$10 dues. Vote was unanimous.

Sweatshirt Jacket Class- at the class on April 2, a pattern different from the one used is missing. Please see Georgia if you have it.

We saw many beautiful projects during our show and tell.

April Program – After a break for refreshments, Ann Hannehan from The Bobbin Case, also a Quilt-in-a-Day certified teacher did a demo on making fabric bowls.
