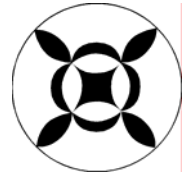

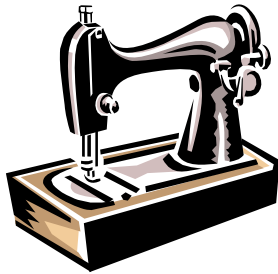

## Show and Tell Review

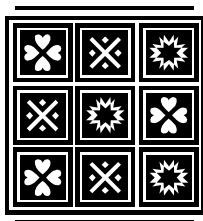
I would first like to compliment Georgia Sadler on taking on this challenge. When she called and asked me to cover for her, I readily accepted, not really having any idea what I had agreed to. I have taken notes in many meetings before, how hard could this be? In reality, I discovered recording the show and tell turned out to be very difficult. So, here is the summary that I have, I wish it were more detailed. There seems to be an underlying theme in a number of the items that follow, many members are finishing projects they have had in progress or lying around for some time. I wish I were part of that group!

Ann Russo started the night off showing a set of beautiful placements she had made. Ava Conchelos brought the first donation for Women Helping Girls, a table runner with purple tulips on it. Liz Brown showed Helen Kohut's quilt made from leftover pieces of the 30's fabric. Brenda McHale brought the first 'Ducks in a Row' quilt so cute full of reds, black and gold. It is always amazing to me what comes out of these quilts with so many people working on the project. Brenda also brought her Oriental quilt from the last retreat. The quilting was done by 2 Funny Quilters and really made the quilt shine. One of her students, Marilyn Bringman brought the second quilt she made a Fons & Porter star pattern made with bright pinks and turquoises. She also brought a baby quilt that she had redone the yellow sections numerous times as the fabric kept raveling. This baby quilt she made for her nephew. Jeanne Muhl brought a baby quilt featuring Snoopy. This was the 4<sup>th</sup> baby quilt for her friend's children; each quilt has become less elaborate and this one even had machine quilting in it! Mary Jane Kosel followed with a red, white and blue Buffalo Bills quilt that she made from fabric she purchased on eBay. Jeanne Andrychuk did another beautiful job on the machine quilting. Lin Mocejunas brought a pink and beige design made for a friend at work who was graduating this year. She also brought a quillow she made for her grandson. Tara Deo, a visitor from India brought a number of quilts: a log cabin made of purples and creams; a picture quilt of her son and daughter-in-law made from fabric from India; a baby quilt made for her 5 month old granddaughter with a cat and

dog house appliqué; and rows of books that was the first quilt she made. She used fabric from clothes she had made for her daughter. Lisa Priebe brought a beautiful wall hanging she made for her parent's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a very nice border of leaves. Unfortunately, she did not finish the quilt in time for the anniversary, but I am sure her parents really appreciated her hard work. Chris Clark (I wonder if she ever sleeps) finished a quilt she made from charm squares donated to her over the past 2 years. The quilt contained 1,500 separate pieces and none were the same. The quilt was backed with quilting fabric-perfect for this project. Judy Andrychuk made a quilt for a friend's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday (last August), the design was bears paws in brights. Her sister-in-law Jeanne did the quilting. Joan Story made a quilt for another friend in golds and browns. Elaine Kent finished lots of charity quilts. She received 10 tops tonight and turned in 18 to Rochester Oncology, 12 to the Children's hospital at Strong and another Ducks in a Row.

Thanks to everyone who brought in their projects. I welcome Georgia back next meeting.

## Tip of the Month

Cover the top of a wooden TV tray with batting and Teflon fabric. This creates a small and portable ironing surface for use next to your machine, or to take classes or retreats.

Turn your ironing board in the opposite direction from normal use. Place the iron on the narrow end, leaving more wide space for fabrics and patchwork pressing.
