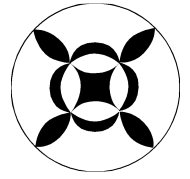

Show and Tell

Jane Ryan made a baby quilt for her new niece born last week in blocks of blue/yellow, green and pink. She ran out of backing material so used a black and white racing stripe for the middle. Jane made a wall hanging of "Tigger" for her step daughter. She had to Google the image then had it enlarged at work. The work was all done by needle turn method with intricate detail of the bees, butterflies and the flowers.

Jocelyn Fiederer did an April Cornell Jelly roll quilt in yellow, green, blue and cranberry. It was the first time she had used this method.

Pattie Pellegrino made a quilt using Susan Rooney's design The Shuffle. It was done in brown, pink and blue cat fabric.

Lyn Covert displayed a quilt that her friend made to show at the Genesee Valley Quilt Show in June. It was made of Elephants done in red, black and gold on a cream background. It was made to promote tourism in Sri Lanka since the Tsunami devastation several years ago.

Lyz has spent the last month sewing. She has made a quilt using the Big Block pattern made smaller in tiny floral print blocks against a white background with a green border.

Using the scrap therapy method, she made small quilt for her soon to be born grandson out of Batik material and a larger one for herself. She quilted them herself at Jackie Lynn's. Lyz also made another baby quilt with the theme "Boys Will Be Boys" done in various color blocks with blue and white squares for the border. She spent a sew weekend with friends and made 15 purses using the Quilt Smart pattern. Lyz tells us that all the material used for these projects came from her stash.

Ann Burton displayed "The Hungry Caterpillar" pattern she made for her grandson.

Donna German made a lovely baby quilt in pink and cream for a family friend's daughter born in March. She made an Iron Caddy with a floral fabric on the front and when opened it can be used as an ironing mat.

Jean Cody attended a Quilt Retreat last weekend at Silver Lake where all the attendees received a small bag and placemat at their tables. She made a beautiful quilt done in green and brown against a tan background. It was from the Into the Woods pattern. Jean is proud to say she used all the fabric from her stash.

Penny Schumacher and her sisters exchange fat quarters of primary colors for Christmas. She made a quilt using dinosaur fabric and red and brown strips to donate to foster children.

Marcia Turpyn took a class at Jackie Lynn's and made a heat resistant table runner. It has a Teflon backing and Insulbrite was used for the batting. She also made a table topper using the Northcott Flower of the month blocks.

Celeste Babcock made a pillow using the Cathedral Window pattern. It was done in pink and black. She took a class at Betty's using appliqué and embroidery and made a quilt of purple and green flowers. She did the backing in muslin. She didn't like the way it looked so put it away and on a gloomy rainy day decided to finish the quilt. She was pleasantly surprised at how nice it looked.

Paula Hansen made a quilt of 30 State birds which she embroidered against a white background while she was in Florida.

Georgia Sadler cut 5 inch squares using the Scrap Therapy technique and made 3 bags using the pattern from McCall's April 2009 magazine. They're great for gifts.

Mary Randall visited her favorite Quilt Shop in Dunedin, Florida "Rainbows End". A wall hanging caught her eye as she was checking out. It was of Lorelie bathing beauties. She bought the panel and embellished it with various color sparkles.

Elaine Kent is asking for help in sewing 2 1/2 inch strips together to make use of leftover fabric to make crazy quilts.

Several completed quilts were displayed and Elaine encouraged members to take

kits and sew them during the summer.

Pink Quilts are being assembled for the Breast Cancer Coalition for September. Two have been completed. All the tops are done and need to be put together for the walk.

Samples of quilt shawls with pockets were displayed and it was suggested that they be donated to Dialysis patients.

Mary Lou Fitch displayed 16 completed Brenda's totes. She asked that members turn in any kits not completed and she will finish them over the summer.

Please remember to bring in any placemats that you have to contribute for Meals on Wheels! If you want to make some for our May meeting, we would like to get any/all themes, and if you have any masculine fabric, it would be put to great use in a placemat made especially for the guys!

For anyone interested in completing a charity quilt (or a few...) Elaine Kent has a stash of kits made up in our storage room at the church. If you want something relatively quick to work on during Sew Night, you are always free to pop into the storage room and grab a kit to work on.

During the bus trip, many....many snacks were passed around. One particular snack was a big hit I got a hold of the recipe!

“Honey Glazed Snack Mix”

Ingredients:

6 cups ----- Crispix
5 cups ----- Mini pretzels
1 ½ cups --- Pecan halves
1 ½ cups --- Butter, cubed
½ cup ----- Honey

Instructions:

Combine Crispix, pretzels, pecans. In a small saucepan, melt butter and honey, stir until smooth. Pour over cereal mixture and mix well. Spread in 2 greased 15” x 10” x 1” baking pans.

Bake 325 degrees for 15 minutes, stirring every 5 minutes. Cool on wire racks store in air tight containers (makes 10 cups).

As Georgia mentioned in President's Pieces, the request was made for the officers to give you ladies an idea of what our fabric preferences are. Georgia's preferences are listed in her piece, as for the rest of us...

Margaret likes batiks, and her favorite colors are purple and green.

Kathy likes batiks, bright colors – red, white, blue.

As for me (Melissa), I like jewel tones and earth tones. My favorite color is purple.
