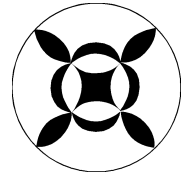

IQC Quilting Tip

It's easy to cut your own fat quarters! First of all remember that a true fat quarter is 18x22. If you're cutting the fat quarter from yardage, you need to have at least ½ yard of fabric to yield 2 fat quarters. When you buy ½ yard of fabric, you get 18" of fabric. That gives you one side of the 18x22. If you cut along the fold of the 45" fabric, that gives you the 22" measurement. Voila, you have 2 fat quarters! If you enter them in the fat quarter drawing, you have 2 chances to win!!
