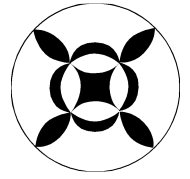

In reviewing the bylaws, there
were a couple of discrepancies
that were noticed and we took a
vote to allow changes and to
ensure that what is written in the
bylaws matches what we do in
reality. The discrepancies were
as follows.

Topic — *Membership Dues for
members 80+:*

This topic was discussed in the
2006 – 2007 club year, but never
formally spelled out. The
question was whether or not the
club wanted to move to waiving
the membership fee of \$20 for
members aged 80+ years. It was
discussed, the motion to waive
membership fees for members

80+ was made by Donna German. The motion was seconded by Penny Schumacher. The Club voted in favor of the measure.

Topic – *Officers serving more than two years*

This was an old topic brought up to clarify the language in the bylaws. The club discusses whether or not officers should be allowed to serve more than two years. Fat Quarter Exchange

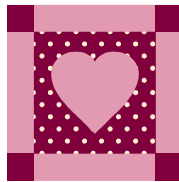
The theme for the September Fat Quarter Exchange was blue fabrics.

Show and Tell

Bev Schwartz made a light blue baby quilt with sheep on it for her niece due next Christmas.

Kathy Russell showed a baby quilt she made in primary colors. Blocks were on point with an animal in each block. She also made a tote bag in aqua with a turtle design. She also had a queen sized Nine Patch in colors of burgundy, black, green, and cream for a wedding gift.

Patti Pellegrino showed two of six pillows in a blue and green design she made for a daybed.

Jean Cody had many things to show! A blue and green Four Patch baby quilt, an Attic

Windows quilt with an animal in each block with turquoise sashing, a Laural Burch Attic Windows quilt. She went to Philadelphia and showed things she made in classes: A Drunkard's Path, and pieces from a class on silk screening, a class on foundation piecing miniatures, a class on instant stained glass and a class on using striped fabric for borders.

Laurie Fromm showed a purse in Oriental floral fabric, a BFF handbag in teal prints, and a Christmas quilt made with a panel!

Elaine Kent took in 207 comfort quilts last year, 21 this summer, and 30 tonight including shawls.

Chris Clark showed two twin sized multi-colored Flower Pots quilts. One had a blue border, the other had a green border. She also showed quilt tops she made for charity – three with a red and blue balloon print, one with teddy bears in green, red, and navy, one with orange and yellow, and another with green and magenta and balloon print fabric.

Mary Randall showed a pumpkin block that she made in a wall hanging with a border leaf pattern with tan and yellow on a black background. She also had a BFF bag she made in green prints, and a Tumbling Leaves table runner she made for the raffle at her High School class reunion.

Pat Fackelman made a quilt for her Doctor's baby made from charm squares with bunnies and bears. She also showed a Block of the Month quilt in thirties prints from a class she took at Ivy Thimble.

Jeanne Muhl showed a baby quilt in yellows and golds. She also made a scrappy Four Patch baby quilt. Finally, she had a full sized Tumbling Blocks quilt top that was hand pieced and scrappy with a purple border.

Mary Louise Garrick, our guest, showed cotton theory items done in blue and yellow reversed to green and rust, white wine/red wine table mats and napkins, and a Quilting by the Lake art quilt.

Cheryl is requesting twin sized (54x78) quilts which would be needed for the September 2010

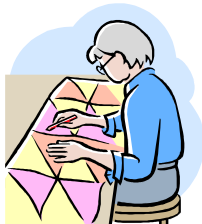
