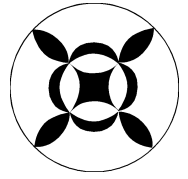

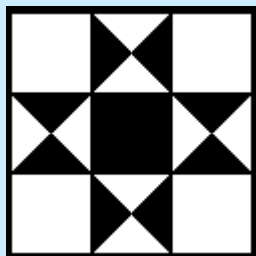

Mariners Compass Class Supply List

freezer paper - from the food wrap aisle in the supermarket

1" x 12 1/2" Omnigrad ruler with adjustable compass points

Note: These are available from Patricia's House of Fabrics and Joann Fabrics. The compass points slide onto the narrow ruler and turn it into a very sturdy and useful compass that will draw circles up to 24" inch diameter.

18" clear plastic ruler (such as C-thru)

Sharp pencils and eraser

rotary cutter, 24" ruler, 12" ruler, and mat

scissors (both sewing and paper scissors)

pins (IBC silk pins highly recommended)

needle and thread

sewing machine

Optional: iron and ironing pad if you have them

Fabric: In class, we will draft and construct one 16 point compass. For this you will need:

1/2 yard background fabric (the space between the rays)

1/4 yard pieces of three or more contrasting fabrics for rays

1/4 yard for center and accent

Good contrast between the rays and background fabric between them is essential. Check each of your fabrics against the background at a distance of 4 - 6 feet. Feel free to bring alternate choices.

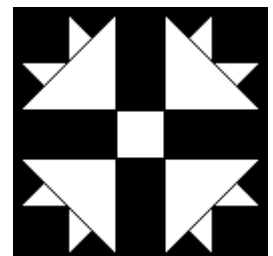

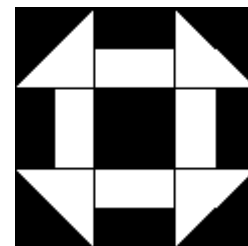
Silent Auction
