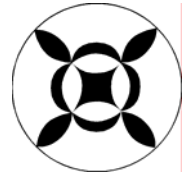

IQC Quilting Tip

Does your thread keep tangling? Take a new fabric softener sheet (made to be used in clothes dryers), sandwich the thread between the sheet and between your thumb and forefinger, then pull the thread between your fingers. The thread glides through the fabric and doesn't tangle or knot.
